

## City of Goleta Releases Video Message from Public Engagement Commission Encouraging Community to Draw District Elections Map

## Watch the Video and Let's Draw Goleta! Maps Due by January 6th!

GOLETA, CA, August 18, 2021 – The City of Goleta is pleased to release a short video message from the Public Engagement Commission encouraging the community to help draw Goleta! The City is moving to district elections for the first time in November of 2022 and is seeking public participation to draw the district boundaries. With district elections, the City will be divided into four districts, and voters in each district will elect a City Council member who lives in their own district. The Mayor will continue to be elected by voters across Goleta. The public can help draw district boundaries on-line at <a href="www.DrawGoleta.org">www.DrawGoleta.org</a> or by using a paper map which are available at City Hall or the Goleta Valley Library during hours of operation. Maps are due by January 6, 2022, to be considered.

For an update on the district elections process, tune into the Public Engagement Commission (Commission) meeting tomorrow August 19, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. Staff will provide the Commission and the public the opportunity to provide feedback including how to ensure public engagement. At last night's August 17<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting, the Council held a public hearing regarding the composition of the City's voting districts and approved a list of communities of interest. A community of interest is a contiguous population which shares common social and economic interests that would benefit from being included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation. Communities of interest may be overlapping sets of neighborhoods, networks, or groups that share interests, views, cultures, histories, languages, and values, and whose boundaries can be identified on a map.
